1st Vange Boy Scouts

The Funerals.

Impressive Scene.

The funerals of the three victims of the explosion took place at Pitsea Church yard on Wednesday, when there was a very impressive and moving scene. The three graves, side by side were in nearly the centre of the Anglican portion of the new graveyard, in line with the south door of the church. There was a congregation of over 500 people.

Numerous relatives and friends of the deceased attended as mourners, the factory proprietors and staff were well represented, and in addition

to the many from the village and places near, there were present post men under Mr Cook, postmaster of Pitsea, police under Sergeant Coe, and members of the Buffalo Lodge in regalia, and boy Scouts, etc.

A contingent of the Boy Scouts bought up the rear. In the church yard the 1st Vange Boy Scouts under Scoutmaster Western, were drawn up as a guard of honour.
